Keep Australia Beautiful Week



Keep Australia Beautiful Week, held annually in August, is a time to raise awareness about taking simple actions each day to reduce impact on the environment.

This year everyone was encouraged to get involved with a Keep Australia Beautiful Council (KABC) program and make a difference.

Staff engaged with schools, communities and local governments across the state to promote and encourage action to reduce litter.

Students from Derby District High School and Holy Rosary School Derby joined the Shire of Derby West-Kimberly to remove over 100kgs of litter from in and around the Jetty. They even had help from the Air Force who assisted in removing the bigger items that were collected.

After an in-class discussion with the Broome Bushrangers, they were keen to clean-up their school grounds. In just 20 minutes, the class collected 6kgs.

More locally, students from Sheoak Grove Primary School helped clean up their local native bushland and are now keen to join the Adopt-a-Spot program and take part in regular clean-ups to keep it litter-free.

This is a great opportunity to engage with remote communities in the Pilbara.

The Environment Minister recently announced all recipients of this year's Community Litter Grants. Fifteen organisations will receive funding to assist with their litter prevention projects.
