Litter Report Scheme

While charity shops are grateful to receive your once loved items, please be sure to deliver your donations during business hours.

Leaving items outside of business hours can lead to them being damaged by the elements or tampered with, which ultimately costs charity shops millions of dollars each year in clean-up costs and waste disposal fees.

To keep your community clean and ensure your donations make a positive impact, please donate during business hours using the following guidelines:



It's illegal to leave donated goods outside charity stores after hours

- 1. Donate During Business Hours: Please take items to the store during business hours. Leaving items outside of business hours is unlawful, unsightly, and often results in damage, making them unsellable.
- 2. Check Before Donating: Not all stores can accept items like furniture, white goods, mattresses, or electrical goods. Call ahead to confirm if your items can be accepted.
- 3. Condition Matters: Broken, damaged, ripped, stained, or faulty items cannot be accepted. As a general rule, if you wouldn't buy it, it probably can't be sold.
- 4. Illegal Dumping Costs Millions: Every year, charity shops spend millions disposing of unsellable items left outside diverting funds from your generous donations which could otherwise support vital programs and services.
- 5. Environmental Impact: Over 80,000 tonnes of unusable donations end up in landfills annually due to illegal dumping. This increases waste and reduces resource recovery.
- 6. Self-Responsibility: Your actions count! Please do the right thing and donate responsibly to avoid being fined.


Adopt-a-Spot

Clean Schools



Last week, we had a great time visiting Atlantis Beach Baptist College, where we met a super enthusiastic bunch of Year 2 students who were getting ready for their big beach clean-up. The visit was all about getting them curious, thinking about the environment, and excited to help take care of their local coastline.

We chatted about how litter affects marine life and how rubbish can travel from our streets all the way to the ocean. The students listened to Seagull by Danny Snell

and then played a boardgame. It was fabulous to see how even the smallest actions—like picking up a stray piece of plastic—really clicked with them.

A few days later, KAB staff joined the students at the Two Rocks Beach. While the sandy shore was fairly free from litter, the students removed 8kg litter from the surrounding street, stopping it from blowing into the ocean.

Australian Litter Measure

KABWA has just completed the Australian Litter Measure Survey (AusLM) May litter count. Fifty-seven sites covering 265 transects have been surveyed.

Litter monitoring and analysis is provided by Perth NRM who provide a yearly report which is used to inform and direct KAB litter prevention projects.



The next report for the 2024–25 year, which includes surveys in November 2024 and May 2025 will be available in July this year and will be available on the KAB website along with past years reports.
