Forest Management Plan 2024-2033 pre-draft survey

As we continue preparing the draft FMP 2024-2033, we have been meeting with stakeholders including industry and peak bodies, government and conservation groups.

Externally facilitated focus groups will be held this month with key stakeholders to inform the development of the draft plan. These discussions will be consistent with the content of a public survey that will run in parallel to this process.
