# About the plan

The draft Forest Management Plan 2024-2033 (FMP 2024-2033) is being prepared by the Conservation and Parks Commission (through DBCA). We're planning to release a draft plan for public comment between October and December 2022.

On 8 September 2021, the McGowan Government announced an end to logging of native forests to preserve at least an additional 400,000 hectares of karri, jarrah and wandoo forests. From 2024, timber taken from south-west native forests will be limited to management activities that improve forest health and clearing for approved mining operations. ### Complete the online survey to have your say


There's still a few days to complete our pre-draft survey on forest management in the south-west.


