

Wander out longer on the Yonga Walk Trail

The Yonga Walk Trail in Lesueur National Park is a 26km loop trail that can be done in one day or overnight. There are camping platforms and a camp shelter halfway along the trail – which must be booked before you go. The trail is open March to November – discover more.



Seal of approval: Tips for safe sea lion encounters

These incredible creatures are currently classified as endangered and are vulnerable to disturbances so it's crucial that we play our part in protecting them. Check out these <u>Seal Wise</u> tips:

- Enjoy seals from a distance: Maintain a minimum distance of 100m from them while in a vessel.
- Let them rest: Avoid visiting their breeding and resting sites and keep at least 30m away from them on land.
- **Do not approach seals in the water**: Keep a safe distance of at least 50m when swimming. Only licensed tour operators such as The Lobster Shack, Jurien Bay Oceanic and Sea Lion Charters are permitted closer access under specific conditions.
- If you come across a sick, injured, or deceased seal, contact the Wildcare Helpline at 9474 9055.


