CHAIRMAN S REPORT FOR 2004-2005 Perth Observatory Volunteer Group

The year has passed with a few significant initiatives, but in many ways one that could be termed a year of quiet achievements

Our support for the Observatory resulted in a total hours on deck of 1732 hours for 2004. Since the last AGM, there were 114 night-viewings advertised. We assisted on other special viewing nights, at other functions and in archiving. As pointed out by the Observatory Director, the total hours are equivalent to an extra full-time person; a considerable help we can justifiably be proud of.

The enthusiasm by the Vollies for helping is clearly seen in the devotion to duty of the members, turning up on all types of nights, regardless of the weather conditions and their cheerful disposition.

As with all voluntary organisations, there has been a slow loss of some members. It is always sorrowful to see experienced members leave, especially when circumstances beyond their control forced them to make the decision. To those who have left, a big Thank you for helping and for being part of our group.

New intake of Vollies

A new intake of Vollies saw 15 new chums being accepted for training in early

2005. We will formally welcome them into the POVG progressively as they pass through probation and become full volunteers.

We have taken two steps to try to bolster our financial support for the Observatory during the past year.

Volunteer Group to become a Deductible Gift Recipient (DGR)

Firstly, we have moved to enable the Volunteer Group to become a Deductible Gift Recipient (DGR) as termed by the Taxation Office. This means that we will be able to accept gifts that the donor can claim as a tax deduction. Under the law, we can only do this as a Cultural Organisation, requiring us to be put on the List of Registered Cultural organisations by the Federal Minister for Cultural organisations, Information Technology and The Arts and the Federal Treasurer. Our constitution requires amending to more clearly identify that management, protection and support of culture is one of our principle purposes. We can do that because there is much cultural heritage related to the Observatory property and the grand history as one of Western Australia s scientific organisations; we just have to ensure it is enshrined clearly in our Constitution.

The second step is to consider us becom-

ing part of the Western Australian Community Foundation. This foundation has been established as a means of voluntary organisations receiving and holding money in a fund amalgamated with other DGRs funds. The fund is guaranteed under the State Government, and its role is to locate the best interest-earning available to funds pooled by all the members of the Foundation. It works by amalgamating each individual s funds to create a large amount that can attract better interest. We need a \$10 000 donation to kick-start our program. Once we have funds, we can apply them in support of the Observatory s roles, as we were originally set up to do so. We have applied twice during the year for grants from the Commonwealth's Small Equipment Volunteer Grants program, the first was unsuccessful, and the second is still outstanding. The funding, of about \$2000, is intended to provide jackets and hats for vollies to wear at night viewing sessions. By having insulated, co-ordinated jackets, members will present a more professional appearance, and be warmer on the cold nights.

Night viewings

Night viewings have not been quite as headline catching, as in the previous year when the proximity of Mars generated much community enthusiasm for astronomy and we had a very early, and extremely successful, start to the viewing nights. However, the transit of Venus was a notable, though daytime, event.

Monthly training nights

receiving training in the use of the equipment. Of particular note was that all received training in use of the laser pointers, to ensure the public is protected when we use these potentially dangerous instruments.

Field excursion to the Shoemaker Impact Structure

The highlight of the year for me was the field excursion to view the Shoemaker Impact Structure, and along the way we visited the newly-identified Yarrabubba Impact Structure as well as Dalgaranga Crater and the Yallalie Structure, over five days. Six members were accompanied by six members of the public. It was a marvellous success: looking at the results of four extremely diverse impacts; sleeping under the stars

beside the 4WD bus; sharing the company of other like-minded enthusiasts; and having a well-experienced, professional company putting the details in place. Frank Bilki and I produced a rather professional field guide for all attendees, the first formal publication of the POVG.

And while on publications, Jeff Alcroft continued preparing the monthly Vollie News, keeping us all informed about the group and the world of astronomy.


