THREE APC DONATED FOR USE IN THE INTERNET TELESCOPE PROJECT.

The "POVG has just received a donation of three refurbished APC BackUPS 600 uninterruptible power supplies (UPS) for use in the Internet telescope project. Our kind benefactor is Dean Elliott, proprietor of KaeJen Services, who provides UPS maintenance services to the place that I work. Basically they are retired UPSes that have been fitted with new batteries to give them a new lease of life and should be good for a few years (no guarantees though).

The UPSes will likely be deployed for use with the satellite internet controller (Vollie PC), cloud detector controller and, well, presumably the scope or something, but I'd guess the final decision on precisely where they will be used will be at Arie's discretion.

STOLEN METEORITE WARNING
'Some low type cut the chain holding our
"touch and feel" fragment of Boxhole
meteorite and absconded with it. Just
in case they approach one of you in the
hope of selling it, here's a description:

The fragment is adult-fist-sized, say 12cm, very roughly scone-shaped, with the usual rusty, baked and pitted meteorite exterior. Weight is around a kilogram (we never actually weighed it). The distinguishing feature is the threaded hole for the bolt which attached the chain; very few meteorites come with this.


If you are offered this specimen, please take it for inspection and hold it for us to collect, get the details of the vendor if possible and let us know.


