Perth Observatory Volunteer Group Inc. Minutes of Meeting - 21st August 2006

Present. J. Biggs, D. Alderson, R. Boelen, B. Harris, L. Martin, J. Milner, J. Morris, L. Robinson, E. Walker,. Apologies.. T. Beston, I. Baran, D. Emerich, M. Freeman.

Meeting commenced at 7.25pm Confirmation of Minutes.. Moved B.Harris seconded L.Robinson.

Business Arising from the minutes.

- o The new gate to be built across Walnut Road is currently waiting to be approved by a full meeting of the Kalamunda Shire Council, after being approved by the council Works Committee. There will then be a further wait while the change is advertised and any appeals heard. The body of the gate has already been constructed.
- o The social Quiz Night went ahead in July and was a fun occasion for all who attended.
- o A new intake of volunteers should occur in September, in time to help out with the upcoming season of night tours.
- o The operating budget for the Observatory for the coming year from the state government has been announced at \$40,000 which is still not enough to cover current expenses. In light of this J. Biggs has requested the POVG to set up a petition to gain more government funding by outlining what activities go on at the Observatory and how more funds would benefit everyone. A mock-up of a information poster and the accompanying petition will be prepared for ratification at the September meeting.

Treasurers Report.

o $\,$ B. Harris stated that there had still been no movement in the account and the current balance was \$940.65 .

- o The financial statements for 2004/05 and 2005/06 have been audited by Mr Max Williams. He also provided the figures in the format required for when the POVG becomes a charity. Bevan has thanked Mr Williams for his assistance.
- o J. Biggs observed that the POVG should be registered in the Australian Philanthropy manual as Tax Deductible Gift Recipients. M. Freeman should have the details for this and will be contacted to put this in motion.
- o Mr Williams also advised that we should not let the current balance stay static for too long and that the current funds should be spent. J. Biggs will have some suggestions for possible expenditure at the September meeting.

General Business:

- o The issue of the rising cost of petrol is being recognised as having an impact on volunteer activities around Australia. Some reimbursement for fuel costs may come about in the future but not immediately.
- o J. Biggs said that the forms for the Working With Children Check card are now available at all Australia Post offices. All Observatory volunteers must pick up a form, fill it in (Sect 12 in particular) and bring it in for Jamie to sign. You must also get a passport photo done to go with the application. The cost for volunteers is \$10, which will be reimbursed. Once the card is issued you must show it to Jamie so he can record the relevant serial number to allow him to check up on individual's details every three months.



Hubble Captures a Rare Eclipse on Uranus

This NASA Hubble Space Telescope image is a never-beforeseen astronomical alignment of a moon traversing the face of Uranus, and its accompanying shadow. The white dot near the center of Uranus' blue-green disk is the icy moon Ariel. The 700-mile-diameter satellite is casting a shadow onto the cloud tops of Uranus. To an observer on Uranus, this would appear as a solar eclipse, where the moon briefly blocks out the Sun as its shadow races across Uranus's cloud tops. Though such "transits" by moons across the disks of their parents are commonplace for some other gas giant planets, such as Jupiter, the satellites of Uranus orbit the planet in such a way that they rarely cast shadows on the planet's surface. Uranus is tilted so that its spin axis lies nearly in its orbital plane. The planet is essentially tipped over on its side. The moons of Uranus orbit the planet above the equator, so their paths align edge-on to the Sun only every 42 years. This color composite image was created from images at three wavelengths in near infrared light obtained with Hubble's Advanced Camera for Surveys on July 26, 2006.
