# PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Lieutenant-General Sir Charles Henry Galrdner, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Companion of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Commander of the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire, Governor in and over the State of Western Australia and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia.

WHEREAS by section 11 of the Native Administration Act, 1905-1947 (reprinted), it is provided that the Governor is empowered by Proclamation to declare any Crown lands to be a Reserve for Natives; and whereas it is deemed desirable that a Reserve for Natives be declared in the Broome District. Now, therefore, I, the said Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby declare the area more particularly described in the Schedule hereto to be a Reserve for Natives.

## Schedule.

Broome District Reserve 23458 (Natives). All that portion of land being Broome Lot 659 and comprising about 36 acres.

IN pursuance of the provisions of section 14 of the Fauna Protection Act, 1950, I, the Governor of the State of Western Australia, do hereby declare Grey Kangaroos, known scientifically as *Macropus* ocydromus, not protected for a period of five years from 1st July, 1952, throughout all that portion of the State as defined in the Schedule hereto.

#### Schedule.

All that portion of the State of Western Australia lying North and East of a line starting at the shore of the Indian Ocean at the 31st parallel of South latitude and extending East to the 118th meridian, thence South to the 34th parallel of South latitude, and thence East to the shore of the Southern Ocean.

WHEREAS by sections 223 and 225 of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1906-1947 (6 Edwardi, No. 32), it shall be lawful for the Governor, on request of the Council, by notice in the Government Gazette, to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street or way, or any place, bridge, or thoroughfare, to be a public highway; and such land shall thereupon and thenceforth, from the date of such Proclamation, become and be absolutely decidated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law now or hereafter in force; and whereas the Bunbury Municipal Council has requested that certain land named and described in the Schedule hereunder which has been used for a street or way within the Municipality of Bunbury, be declared a public highway: Now, therefore I, the said Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Countries. with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation declare the said land to be a public highway, and such land shall, from the date of this Proclamation, be absolutely dedicated to the public as a highway within the meaning of any law now or hereafter in force.

WHEREAS by section 99 of the Factories and Shops Act, 1920-1951, the Governor may, by proclamation, constitute any defined portion of the State a shop district for the purposes of this Act, and specify the boundaries of such district, and may abolish or alter the boundaries of any district, and abolish or alter the boundaries of any district, and may assign a name to or change the name of any district; and whereas it is desired to bring certain shop districts into conformity with the road districts and municipal districts bearing the same names as at present constituted under the Road Districts Act, 1919-1947, and the Municipal Corporations Act, 1906-1947.
