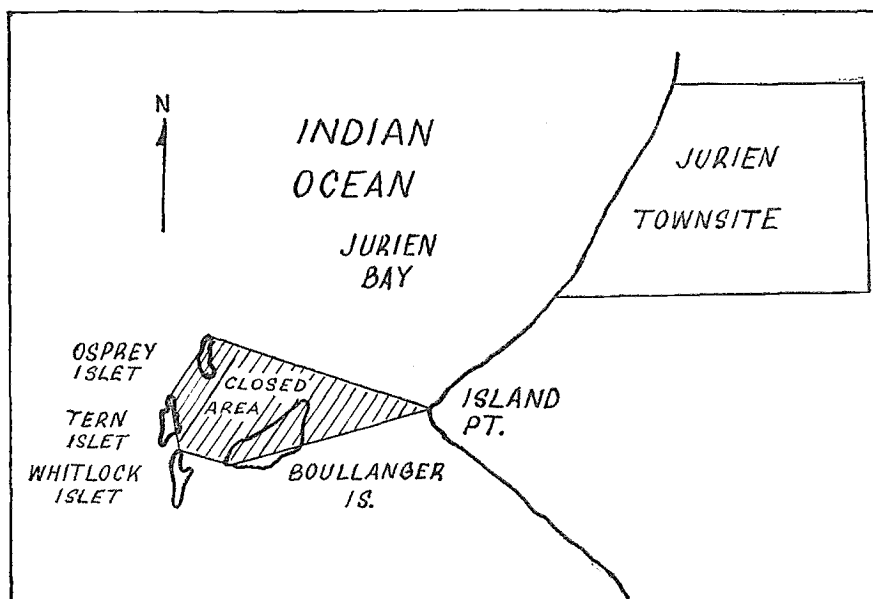

THE Minister for Fisheries and Fauna, pursuant to the powers conferred by section 9 of the Fisheries Act, 1905-1969, does hereby prohibit all persons from taking by any means of capture whatsoever the fish known as or called "rock lobster" in all that portion of Western Australian waters specified in the schedule hereto.

Schedule.

All that portion of Ocean bounded by lines starting at a point on the High Water Mark of the Indian Ocean at the westernmost point of Island Point and extending westerly to the northernmost point of Osprey Islet; thence south-westerly to the northernmost point of Tern Islet; thence southerly to the northernmost point of Whitlock Islet; thence southeasterly to the southwestern point of Boullanger Island and thence easterly to the starting point, as indicated on the sketch below.

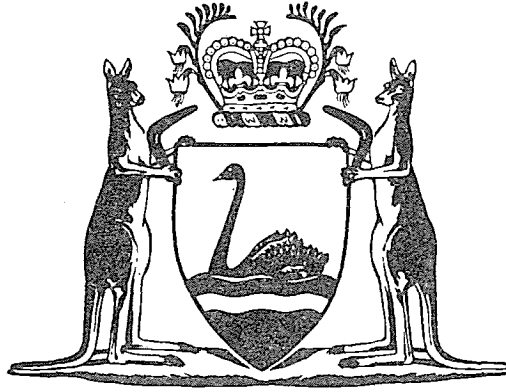
