WILDLIFE CONSERVATION ACT 1950

WILDLIFE CONSERVATION (PROTECTED INVERTEBRATE FAUNA) NOTICE 1994

Made by the Minister under section 14 (2) (a).

Citation

1. This notice may be cited as the Wildlife Conservation (Protected Invertebrate Fauna) Notice 1994.

Interpretation

2. In this notice "marine nature reserve" and "marine park" have the same meanings as in the Conservation and Land Management Act 1984.

Certain invertebrate fauna declared protected

- 3. (1) Invertebrate fauna of the species listed in Schedule 1 is declared protected throughout the whole of the State.
- (2) All invertebrate fauna within a marine nature reserve, or a marine park, is declared protected.

Closed season declared in respect of protected invertebrate fauna

- 4. (1) Subject to subclauses (2) and (3), a closed season is declared in respect of the invertebrate fauna referred to in clause 3.
- (2) A person may only take the invertebrate fauna declared protected under clause 3 (1) in accordance with the Act.
- (3) A person may only take the invertebrate fauna declared protected under clause 3 (2) in accordance with the Act or if, apart from this notice, the taking of such fauna would be lawful under the Fisheries Act 1905 or the Conservation and Land Management Act 1984.

Revocation

5. The notice with the heading "Invertebrate Fauna", made by the Minister for Conservation and Land Management under section 14 of the Act and published in the *Gazette* of 11 December 1987 at p. 4381, is revoked.

WILDLIFE CONSERVATION (SPECIALLY PROTECTED FAUNA) NOTICE 1994

Made by the Minister under section 14 (2) (ba).

Citation

1. This notice may be cited as the Wildlife Conservation (Specially Protected Fauna) Notice 1994.

Interpretation

2. In this notice, "taxon" (the plural of which is "taxa") includes any taxon that is described by a family name, or a genus name, and any other name or description.

Declaration of specially protected fauna

- 3. For the purposes of the Act, all taxa of the fauna
 - (a) specified in Schedule 1, being fauna which is rare or likely to become extinct, are declared to be fauna that is in need of special protection;
 - (b) specified in Schedule 2, being fauna which is presumed to be extinct, are declared to be fauna that is in need of special protection;
 - (c) specified in Schedule 3, being birds which are subject to an agreement between the governments of Australia and Japan relating to the protection of migratory birds and birds in danger of extinction, are declared to be fauna that is in need of special protection; and
 - (d) specified in Schedule 4 are declared to be fauna that is in need of special protection, otherwise than for the reasons mentioned in paragraphs (a), (b) and (c).

Effect of declaration of specially protected fauna

4. Fauna declared under clause 3 to be in need of special protection is wholly protected throughout the whole of the State at all times.

Revocation

5. The notice made by the Minister under section 14 of the Act and published in the *Gazette* on 16 November 1990 at pp. 5696-7 is revoked.
