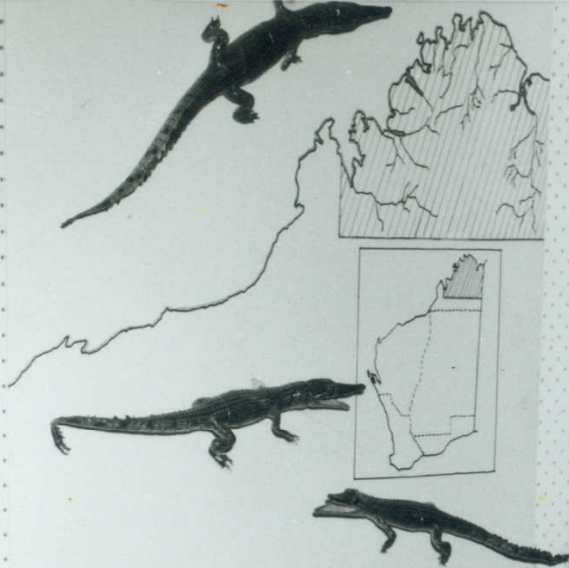
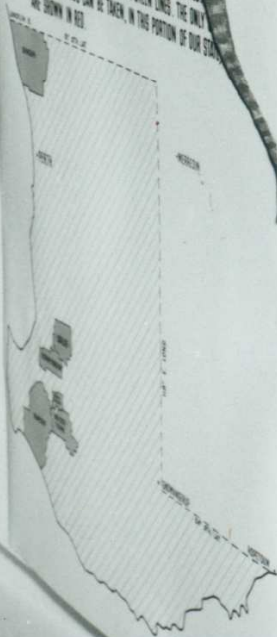

THIS MAP SHOWS THE AREAS WHERE EMUS ARE PROTECTED. SHADY AREA IS MARKED IN DASHED GREEN LINES. THE ONLY AREAS WHERE EMUS CAN BE TAKEN IN THIS PORTION OF OUR STATE ARE SHOWN IN RED.

The Johnstone Crocodile lives in the rivers and tidal estuaries living within the shaded area of our north-west. This species is totally protected and must not be interfered with. Salt Water Crocodiles are also found in this area, this species is unprotected.
