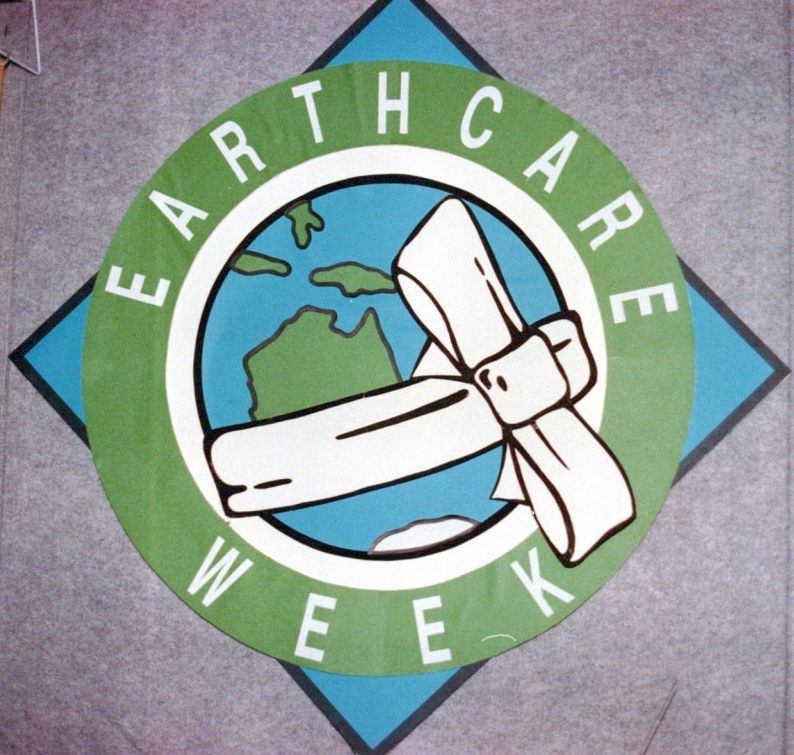

the same.

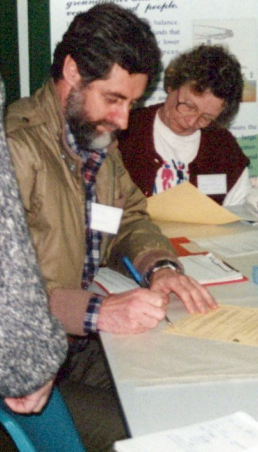


Too much of a good thing
