SAFETY TIPS WHILE IN THE BUSHLAND

Suitable footwear, clothing and gloves must be worn. Sunscreen and a limited supply of gloves are available if required.

Some weeds and items of rubbish are dangerous. Do not attempt to remove sharp items, call a supervisor.

You are responsible for your safety and the safety of everyone else.

Stay with the group and ensure you sign the register before starting.

Report any injuries to a supervisor, first aid is available on site.

BUSHLAND CARE TIPS

Do not remove a plant unless you are sure it is a weed, if unsure ask or leave it in place. Look at the target weeds on the display board.

Remove weeds and rubbish from the bushland and place in piles where *marked*. Collect rubbish in red bags (collect aluminium cans and wires separately for recycling if possible).

As you walk, the bushland is delicate, especially in open or *is*.

Remove sheets of metal, lumps of wood as during winter they are suitable homes for lizards and insects hibernating from the *is* (in the absence of logs). Please leave them in place so as not to disturb the wildlife.
