FIRST CONFERENCE OF SENIOR FIELD OFFICERS OF  
WESTERN AUSTRALIA, held on July 17th & 18th 1923. 1923

Note--A printed report of the proceedings will be found  
in the records of the Forests Department.

The official photograph includes Assistant Foresters  
Doust, Trainor, Hebb and Perry, though the last two mentioned  
are not listed in the report. The four were observers.

In the photograph, in the second row Stanley, Hebb and Perry  
stand in that order.

C.A. Gardner, botanical collector, later became Government  
Botanist.

Senior officers of the Clerical Division attended, These  
were Hill, Telfer, Stanley and Bown, though the name of the  
latter is mis-spelled as Brown in the report.

Now known to be alive, 50 years later, are  
Weston, Stanley, Perry, Hill, Rule, Kessel, Stoate, Brockway, Gray  
and perhaps Doust.

Those now resident outside Australia are Rule (England)  
Gray (England) Stoate (Canada)

Resident in Australia but outside Western Australia  
Kessell (Victoria).
