M18.2 Shire of Swan be encouraged to prepare management plans for Reserves C26864 and C26865.	Unresolved Issues	Resources have not been allocated by the local authority for the preparation and implementation of a management plan.

SUBMISSION IN BRIEF (M18)

105(3)	N.P. Sudlow (G.L. Salom & Associates)	Inquires on behalf of client as to future of Swan Location 1316, Lot 120, which adjoins Walyunga NP.
205(4)	Shire of Swan	Endorses M18.1 and M18.3. Opposes mining in the Avon Valley.
286(1)	W.A. Govt. Railways Commission	Points out that existing railway follows river valley through reserve and questions whether this might be possible source of conflict.
288	A. McLaughlin	Owner of Lot 7 in Location 1341 opposes recomm. M18.1 as interfering with commercial viability of beef farming in lot and so depriving owner of return on large investment.
297(7)	S.P. Hume (Aboriginal Advancement Council of W.A.)	Property owned by Council at 121 O'Brien Road has been subject to vandalism when public access has been allowed. It is intended to make land a wildlife sanctuary.
339(8)	J.B. Barker	Calls for public pedestrian and vehicle access (subject to toll) to both sides of Swan-Avon River from Upper Swan to Toodyay.
372(8)	P. Hutches	Calls for protection of Avon River between Walyunga and Avon Valley National Parks.
386(9)	W.G. England	Endorses.
403(9)	R.F. May	Stresses importance of management of land adjacent to National Park.
468(11)	L. Tunbridge	Landowner opposes any form of joint management of his property. Opposes allowing public access to property because of past problems of rubbish dumping, leaving of fires and firing of guns. Improvement of existing National Park should receive priority.
494(12)	M. Vaughan	Endorses.
552(13)	Main Roads Dept.	Because of shortage of road building materials on Great Northern Highway there may be a need to take some materials from M18.
591(13)	B.C. Mahon	Opposes joint management of land adjacent to NP. Land should either be purchased outright or left wholly under control of owner. Should land be acquired in area it should be solely for the purpose of conservation, contrary to M18.2. Contends that Report's statement that bauxite potential is low in M18 is incorrect.
606(14)	Waterways Commission	Endorses M18.1 and M18.2.

759(17)	Department of Fisheries and Wildlife	M18.2 - joint vesting is opposed. The Department's alternative proposal for resolving land use conflicts would involve leaving area involved as vacant Crown land. The area could be viewed as prospective addition to Walyunga NP.
985(20)	W.A. Heritage Committee	Walyunga NP contains archaeological sites worthy of documentation and consideration by the vested authority.
1036(22)	Darling Range Branch, W.A. Naturalists Club	Endorses acquisition of land adjoining NP for the purpose of conservation of flora and fauna.
1068(23)	Midland Brick Co.	Expresses concern that access road built by company for extraction of shale from lots 1009, 1010, 1356 and 1355 lies partly within M18. Restriction of use of road would cause considerable cost to company.
1093(23)	M.J. & F.L. Jones	Opposes M18.1 and M18.2. Owners purchased lot 119 with intention of building house on it and so oppose acquisition of land or any form of joint management.
1145(24)	Metropolitan Region Planning Authority	Extensive areas of freehold land would be appropriate for inclusion in the NP with such land possibly being obtained through the planning process.
1153(25)	L. Stretch	M18.2 - mining potential should not be recognised because of dangers of salinity, dieback, and erosion.
1168(25)	Extractive Industries Association	Opposes M18.1 Mining potential should be protected in Reserves C26864 and C26865 whether or not freehold land referred to in M18.2 is acquired.
1177(25)	G.K. Binckes	Walyunga NP should be linked to Avon Valley NP. The privately owned land east of Walyunga NP should be acquired and added to the park.
1262(26)	Amateur Canoe Association of Western Australia	Walyunga NP and Avon Valley NP should be linked by a corridor extending 20 metres either side of the river. It should not be a deterrent to creation of linking corridor that it will incorporate some private land. A similar corridor should be extended downstream to Great Northern Highway.

1269(27)	W., C., & Z. Kaeding	Calls for protection of tortoises in M18.
1329(28)	J.H. Lord & Associates	M18 requires full assessment of its mineral potential before any final decisions are made concerning land use.
1336(29)	Western Australian Naturalist's Club	Walyunga NP should be changed to a Regional Park with "A" class status and vested in a management authority responsible for other such parks.
1405(30)	A. McLoughlin, B.V. Herrera and B. Officer	Opposes proposals for joint management or acquisition of land adjacent to Walyunga NP on western side for these reasons: (i) area concerned important for water supply containing three dams and one spring. (ii) present grazing practices reduce fire hazard by controlling grasses. (iii) area concerned would include entire road access of Mr. McLoughlin's farm. (iv) the small size of the area makes it of minimal conservation value.
1418	Conservation Council of W.A.	The parts of Swan Locations 2 and 1316 controlled and managed by the NPA should be added to Reserve A2065. Any adjoining freehold land which can be purchased should be added to reserve A2065.
1429(31)	P. Hussey	Opposes M18.2. The land should be acquired but should be added to Reserve A2065, given "A" class status, and vested in the NPA. Endorses concept of linking Walyunga NP within Avon Valley NP.
1429(31)	Campaign to Save Native Forests	Endorses M18.1 M18.2 if freehold land east of park is acquired it should be made an integral part of Walyunga NP rather than being given "C" class status. M18.3 - Reserves C26864 and C26865 should be cancelled and their areas added to Walyunga NP. Opposes building of a storage dam.
1435(31)	Mines Department	Calls for the recommendations to be considered in conjunction with Department views on joint vesting and geological assessment (provided earlier in submission).
