M32.1 Purpose of Reserves C18130 and C34103 be amended to Parkland and Reserves be vested in Mundaring Shire.	Partially Implemented	Reserve C34103 is now a Parkland Reserve vested in Shire of Mundaring. Vesting and management objective for Reserve C18130 unresolved. The area is being considered as part of the Darling Range Regional Park study.
M32.2 Reserves C18130 and C34103 be managed for long term conservation of natural flora and fauna.	Unresolved Issues	Reserve C34103 is now a Parkland Reserve vested in Shire of Mundaring. The local authority's position with respect to Reserve C18130 is that it should be managed by CALM. The Darling Range Regional Park study is proposing that Reserve C18130 be returned to State Forest.
M32.3 Mundaring Shire Council in consultation with EPA prepare a management plan encouraging local indigenous flora.	Unresolved Issues	Resources have not been allocated by the local authority at this stage.

RE: SYSTEM SIX UPDATE

Further to my letter dated 12th September 1995 regarding the above, please find attached the preliminary list of reserves for consideration as System Six areas from the Reserves Study (Stage 2).

Most of the areas put forward for consideration are groupings of potentially high conservation reserves greater than 5 hectares identified from the Stage 2 database.

Highlighted maps accompany those reserves recommended from the Stage 2 database to assist with location and interpretation. Briefing notes and the full list of preliminary reserves are attached for your information. Details regarding area, vesting and purpose of all unsecured bushland reserves within the Shire of Mundaring are also attached for your reference, together with the 'Final Criteria' document. I recognise that this update is quite a complex undertaking and offer our services to assist your Organisation in this project.

I understand from discussions with Ms Bridget Hyder that there was some difficulty in locating some of the reserves recommended in our previous submission.

In order to clarify any outstanding issues, it may be appropriate for your staff to meet with Shire staff. The Shire has a set of working maps which identify all reserves which may be worthwhile to consult as part of your investigations. Please contact me if you wish to arrange a suitable meeting time.

BILGOMAN BLOCK

The Bilgoman Block (see Plan 1) comprises a variety of bushland reserves south of Great Eastern Highway and west of Bilgoman Road in the Glen Forrest/Greenmount area. The Bilgoman Block is also linked to the northern section of M34 and is directly adjacent to the John Forrest National Park forming an important link to these significant conservation reserves. The Bilgoman Block comprises the following reserves:

- ↑6922 (#29)
- ↑32137 (Not listed)
- ↑28530 (Not listed)
- ↑28383 (#50)
- SPC 105, 107, 108, 109
- ↑9967 (Not listed)

It is not certain whether DPUD Lot 111 is capable of being incorporated into the Block.

It is also not clear of the location of Property Numbers 110845 (#31) and 110846 (#14) which are likely to form the linkage between the Bilgoman Block and the Greenmount National Park M29.
