M84.1 Regional park recommendations be applied to this area.	Implemented	The area is now part of the Serpentine National Park, A Class reserve 39825, vested in the NPNC (gazetted 6 February 1987). This area is being considered as part of the Darling Range Regional Park study coordinated by DPUD. The Regional Parks Task Force report lists Darling Range as a proposed regional park. The gazettal of the area as a national park and CALM's management of the area conforms with the regional park recommendation.
M84.2 Procedures in recommendations 1-5, chapter 2, System 6 Red Book be applied to MPA.	Partially Implemented	CALM is currently preparing a management plan for the area.
M84.3 Reserve B990 be cancelled, its area added to State Forest and managed as MPA.	Implementation Progressing	To be reserved as conservation park vested in the NPNC.
M84.4 Reserve B988 be cancelled, its area added to State Forest and managed as MPA.	Implemented	Now a C Class conservation park vested in the NPNC (gazetted 8/1/93).
M84.5 Freehold land held in the name of Crown comprising Cockburn Sound Locations 178, 306, 333 and 624 be managed as part of MPA.	Implementation Progressing	WAWA and CALM have agreed to negotiate joint management through Section 16 of the CALM Act. The land would be managed as though part of Serpentine National Park.
M84.6 Should recommendation M84.2 be implemented, and if alternative camping facilities are required, CALM consult Serpentine-Jarrahdale Shire Council and other relevant authorities with regard land exchange.	Implementation progressing	CALM and the Shire have agreed that the vesting of Reserve B990 be changed to conservation park vested in the NPNC and that an area of the CALM estate can go to the Shire in exchange.

Management of the area as a national park would satisfy the intent of the regional park recommendation.
